### 148 Students Graduated...754 graduates to date

Our student body is a mix of former gang members, exoffenders and the homeless. We love hosting huge graduation ceremonies for our students, their families and friends. Due to COVID, this wasn't possible this year.

#### 710 Certifications Awarded to date

Every single student passed their welding certification skills test this year. We are pleased to report that 100% of our students are certified welders.

### **Mobile Training Launched**

The demand for our program continues to grow. Our most fervent dream was an 18-wheeler outfitted with eight welding stations and a small classroom filling the demand for ReIGNITE Hope programs in neighboring cities within 100 miles of our home base in Gardena. Where students cannot come to us, the mobile training center allows us to go to them. Serving the residents of a nearby housing project, two classes of students graduated and are certified welders. A third class opened in Orange County. All serving residents we couldn't reach from our Gardena facility.





### **Student Stories**

We've had a heart for some time to expand our program to include young men and women living in housing projects throughout the South Bay. Rolling Hills Covenant Church hosted our first Mobile Training Center to residents of the Harbor Hills Housing Project. Blanca graduated with certifications in both MIG and TIG. She is a single mom with two young children. She wanted to prove to her kids, you can overcome your circumstances and succeed in life. She is a great role model. Blanca's future is bright.

Janice Hahn, LA County Supervisor for District 4, hosted a celebration for the graduates of our first Mobile Training class. Here she is watching one of graduates, Alfonso, weld inside the trailer. Alfonso always wanted to learn to weld but lacked the funds to pursue his career of choice. He worked odd jobs as a dishwasher or janitor. He jumped on the chance to learn the welding trade and get assistance finding his first welding job. He was also certified in both MIG and TIG.



## **Financial Summary**


Thanks to the generosity of our many donors, ReIGNITE Hope maintains a strong financial foundation, positioning us to give more men and women what every person needs...hope and a future.

# Our Student Population


52% of our student population have been incarcerated at some point in their life. 35% are currently on parole. According to the Office of U.S. Courts, an astonishing 93% of ex-offenders who secured employment within two years of their release successfully integrated back into society and did not return to prison.
